His extraordinary solo sailing journeys have inspired communities with disabilities worldwide by demonstrating the power of resilience and inclusion for all.





Alongside sharing industry practices, panel discussions featuring companies and organizations leading in accessibility and inclusion, and a special Chinese sign language learning session, the accessibility forum provided an open platform for participants to find inspiration, engage in meaningful reflection, collaborate effectively, and take action toward the shared goal of raising awareness and advancing accessibility and inclusion.







As a champion of accessibility and inclusion since before its opening, Shanghai Disney Resort has launched a series of themed events leading up to this year's International Day of Persons with Disabilities on December 3.
